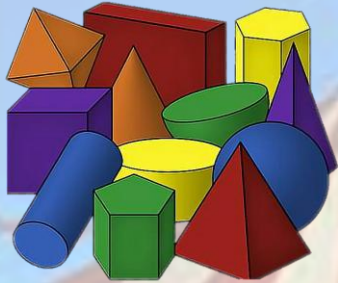

PE:

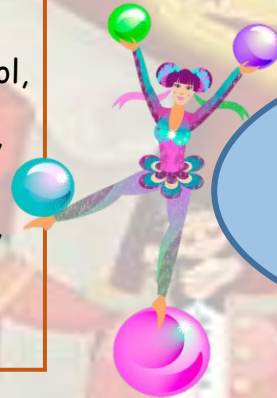

Design Technology:
